# Rates of War Pensions and allowances 2012 - 2013

## About this leaflet

These rates start from the week beginning 09 April 2012. We use Army ranks to show the rates, but they are the same for equivalent ranks in the Royal Navy and Royal Air Force.

The War Pensions Scheme is run by Service Personnel and Veterans Agency, an Executive Agency of the Ministry of Defence. This leaflet gives you general guidance, but it is not a definitive (full) statement of the law. Please remember that the law may change from time to time. This may affect your rights and responsibilites, including whether you are likely to get a War Pension.
